

- + Some users feel that there is a high similarity between different frontend meta-frameworks.
- There are views that these frameworks are useful in eliminating boilerplate code, and are therefore beneficial in certain specific use cases.
- Users have pointed out that there seems to be a rapid growth in the number of frameworks, creating a sense of redundancy.
- + Several users have specifically mentioned Nuxt in a positive light, indicating it as a potential favourite.
- + A degree of nostalgia is present for older, less complex frameworks like jQuery.

In general, opinions on frontend meta-frameworks vary, with some users expressing nostalgia for simpler times, while others appreciate the use-case-specific benefits they offer, despite feeling daunted by the rapid emergence of new frameworks.






